At Moorfield, we work together with the TACT Schools Arts Music Partnership to deliver our music curriculum. We value the importance of music and teach the appreciation of music in all its diversity, culture and history. Music allows children to develop artistic, creative and performance skills and these are taught within our music curriculum.

Our curriculum is designed to provide a sequence of concepts showing clear progression of skills and knowledge in Music. It provides a framework from which relevant learning experiences can be planned to broaden the horizons and experiences of our students, to enable them to recognise and take advantage of opportunities available to them, and to promote the concept of aspirations. The curriculum provides a highly practical approach to address the key skills and concepts of the National Curriculum, while also going above and beyond that.

Opportunities for our children to apply their knowledge and understanding to performance, composition and appraising activities are provided throughout the year and successes celebrated and shared.

The core elements of our music curriculum are:

- Singing and performing
- Read, write and hear
- Playing and exploring
- Listen and appraise

All our children have the opportunity to take part in peripatetic music lessons on a variety of instruments including woodwind, keyboard and guitar throughout the school year. All children who are in receipt of pupil premium are encouraged to access music lessons and all are entitled to have their lessons funded via the Pupil Premium Grant.

We have a thriving school choir who perform at a range of exciting events and concerts both locally and further afield. We also are proud to organise a variety of events each year which promote our love for music and performance for families to enjoy. These include end of term Christmas concerts and performances, choir concerts and end of year shows for Year 6.
