

Religious Education

Our Religious Education programme is planned in line with the Telford and Wrekin Agreed Syllabus and introduces children to many world religions, including Christianity, Islam, Hinduism and Sikhism.

As a school we believe that Religious Education has a significant role to play in the development of pupils' spiritual, moral, social and cultural development. It promotes respect and open-mindedness towards others and encourages pupils to develop their own sense of identity and belonging through self-reflection and self-awareness. We actively seek out links within our local community to enrich our R.E. curriculum, including arranging visits to local places of worship, celebrating key religious festivals and talking to visitors from different faiths. We want our children to be inquisitive, to ask questions and to grow into citizens who will flourish in today's multi-cultural society.

As a school we meet together on a daily basis for Collective Worship. Collective Worship is led by the Headteacher, children and staff and provides opportunities for children to participate, respond and reflect. We respect the right of parents to withdraw their child from Religious Education lessons and/or Collective Worship but this should only be done after consultation with the Headteacher.
